



Globally, road crashes cause 1.3 million preventable deaths and 50 million injuries each year. Unsafe roads have significant economic, social and health costs in low- and middle-income countries, where over 90% of road deaths take place.

The UN Road Safety Fund – launched in 2018 by the UN Secretary General's Special Envoy for Road Safety – guides government action towards achieving SDG 3.6: halving deaths on the road.

THE FUND:

- facilitates partnerships on a global scale to channel effective road safety interventions
- pools financial resources and is the only UN agency solely dedicated to fund road safety initiatives
- demonstrates a multi-sectoral approach to road safety through its projects involving sectors such as transport, health, law enforcement, education and urban planning.











UN Road Safety Fund projects support the five outcome areas of the Global Framework Plan of Action for Road Safety.
